Her eldest child is a daughter, of 18 years: she has 2 sons, one is 13 years and one is 11 years.

Thakro Devi, with the help of relatives, found a match for her elder daughter and appealed to all her village folk and to Arpana for help. "We barely have enough for our monthly rations. I will be grateful for any small amount for my daughter's wedding."

Thanks to Dr. Narinder Kapur's help, Thakro Devi was given assistance in kind, and also a cash gift of Rs. 5000/- which was a blessing, enabling her to host the wedding feast.

Manakh Ram belongs to village Kabra in the dense forests of Jatkari Panchayat accessed only by foot by a trek of 15km, from the road head. This village is 20km from the town of Chamba.

Kabra is a backward village. The farmers are dependent on rainfed agriculture enabling than to grow a single crop, which often is not enough to sustain a family. Manak Ram is 80 years old and his wife is 58 years old. They have 3 daughters and live in deep poverty. The eldest daughter's marriage was fixed, but the family had no resources. Neighbours helped in with materials and Arpana stepped in, to assist the family, thanks to Dr. Kapur's grant. The gift of Rs. 5000/- from Dr. Kapur has made this assistance possible. However extra tuition support, books etc. are all expenses which she and Jai Kumar cannot afford. Thanks to Dr. Narinder Kapur, Arpana gave an educational stipend to Kiran for 2014-2015, of Rs. 6000/- so that she can get tuition support and improve her score and so continue to aim for a good vocational course. There were 2 disabled members in his family. His elder brother, who died recently: his father has a spine ailment and so cannot work as a laborer, which was his occupation. His mother is the sole bread winner. His sister is younger to him. With Dr. Kapur's help, Rahul will get a scholarship for one year for in a vocational skills and life skills course. The amount of Rs. 15000/- will get him admission in the hostel where all his needs will be looked after.

The NGO 'Tapan' where Rahul will be admitted is managed by a dedicated soul, Dr. Sujata. She is confident that she can help Rahul build a future for himself. He will be enrolled in the hostel. This will ease the load on his mother too. We are grateful to Dr. Narinder Kapur for enabling us to assist this extremely vulnerable and unfortunate family.
